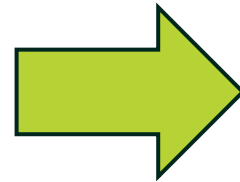
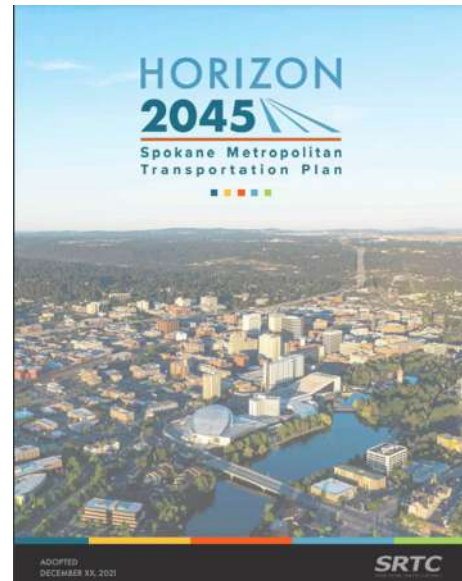

- Objective:

 - Assess through the lens of SRTC's Guiding Principles
- Inform Project list and program areas in Horizon 2050, maintenance/preservation needs, overall costs & timelines

Needs Assessment

- Draft Project Matrix complete
- Sourced from:
 - Agency studies and plans
 - Local Capital and/or Transportation Improvement Programs
 - Unified List
 - Horizon 2045
 - Agency meetings

Needs Assessment

- Matrix attachment shows projects sorted by Agency
 - Filtered into projects that are regional in scope:
 - Currently in Horizon 2045 or Unified List
 - NHS
 - Significant multi-jurisdictional or economic connection
 - Changes capacity






Our population is projected to reach 670,000 in 2050. What do you think?



Rank the biggest transportation challenges for our region:



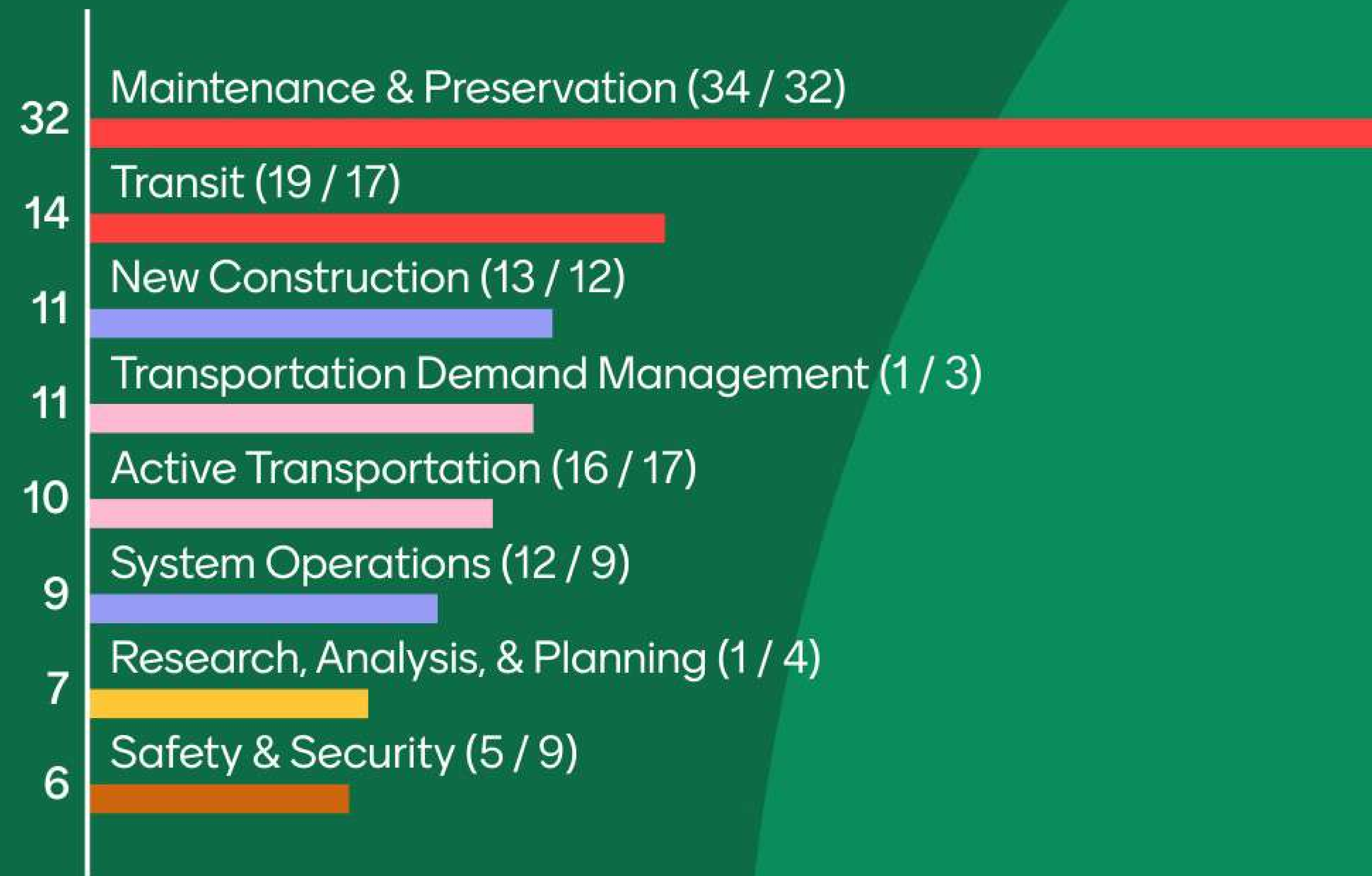
Rank the best ways to optimize the region's transportation system:
