



### Draft Congestion Management Process open for public comments

The Spokane Regional Transportation Council's (SRTC) draft Congestion Management Process (CMP) is open for public comment through April 21.

The Congestion Management Process is a regionally coordinated approach to managing traffic congestion. It provides accurate and up-to-date information on the transportation system's performance and identifies strategies to effectively manage congestion.

The updated Congestion Management Process incorporates recent SRTC planning efforts, new data sources, enhanced analytics and refreshed congestion management strategies.

"The CMP is a technical tool that enables us to address the increasing transportation demands driven by population and employment growth while facilitating regional coordination to identify the most effective strategies for meeting these demands in the future," said David Fletcher, Principal Transportation Planner at SRTC.
