



SRTC seeks input on proposed long-range transportation plan

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: October 10, 2025 | Spokane County, WA

The future of the Spokane region's transportation system is guided by a Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), and the newest version is available for public comment. Titled Horizon 2050, this long-range plan projects more than 20 years into the future, covering topics such as investment and policy priorities, regionally significant projects, growth and land use and more.

Horizon 2050 forecasts over \$16 billion in transportation investments in maintenance, preservation, and projects and programs.

What is the MTP?

The MTP is a foundational document that consists of planning for all modes of transportation, demographic and population projections, regional transportation needs, public engagement, a financial forecast and coordination with local, state and federal stakeholders.

SRTC updates the MTP every 4-5 years. During the creation of Horizon 2050, SRTC conducted outreach across Spokane County that influenced the plan. During every MTP update, SRTC makes the final draft available to the community for review and comment.
