



SRTC seeks input on proposed plan for regional transportation projects

Spokane Regional Transportation Council (SRTC) has developed a draft 2027-2030 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and is asking community members to share their thoughts about the proposed transportation investments. The TIP is a comprehensive four-year program containing regionally significant transportation projects from various jurisdictions and agencies in Spokane County.

The 2027-2030 TIP contains 59 projects and over \$660 million of proposed transportation investments to be spent in the upcoming four years.

What is the TIP?

The TIP contains a wide variety of transportation projects in Spokane County. Some examples include projects that maintain existing roads, public transit investments and bridge repairs.

SRTC updates the TIP annually and makes it available to the community for review and comment. The document includes project names and descriptions, jurisdictions sponsoring them, funding attached to each project and where the funding came from (local, state or federal dollars).
